Due to the hot weather please ensure that your child has sun cream applied before they come to school and that they have access to a water bottle in school.

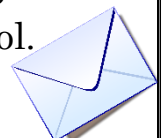

OUR SCHOOL'S LOCKDOWN GUIDANCE

Our School's Lockdown procedures may be activated in response to any number of situations, but some of the more typical ones might be:

- A reported incident or civil disturbance in the local community which potentially poses a risk to the school community.
- An intruder on the school site with the potential to pose a risk to pupils, staff and visitors.
- A warning being received regarding a local risk of air pollution (e.g. smoke plume, gas cloud).
- A major fire in the vicinity of the school.
- The close proximity of a dangerous dog roaming loose.

We will communicate this with you by text message for example;

'The school is in a full lockdown situation. During this period the phones and entrances will be un-manned, external doors locked and nobody allowed in or out.'

Please be reassured that the school understands your concern for your child's welfare, and that it will be doing everything possible to ensure his/her safety.

We will keep you updated by text message and where possible will also post a message on the school website's front page.

What you need to do

- You do not need to contact the school. Calling the school could tie up telephone lines that are needed for contacting emergency providers
- Do not come to the school. They could interfere with emergency provider's access to the school and may even put themselves and others in danger
- Wait for the school to contact you about when it is safe for you to come get your children, and where this will be from.

MEDICATION IN SCHOOL

If your child needs medication during school hours it is important that you follow these procedures.

- Parent must make the request in writing - forms can be found and filled in at the office.
- The request to administer is to address an acute health issue.
- The parent supplies the 'over the counter' medication for their child only.
- Only original bottles will be accepted. Medication must be 'in-date'.
- The requested dose & frequency is clearly stated by the parent, and consistent with the dosage guidance permitted on the bottle.
