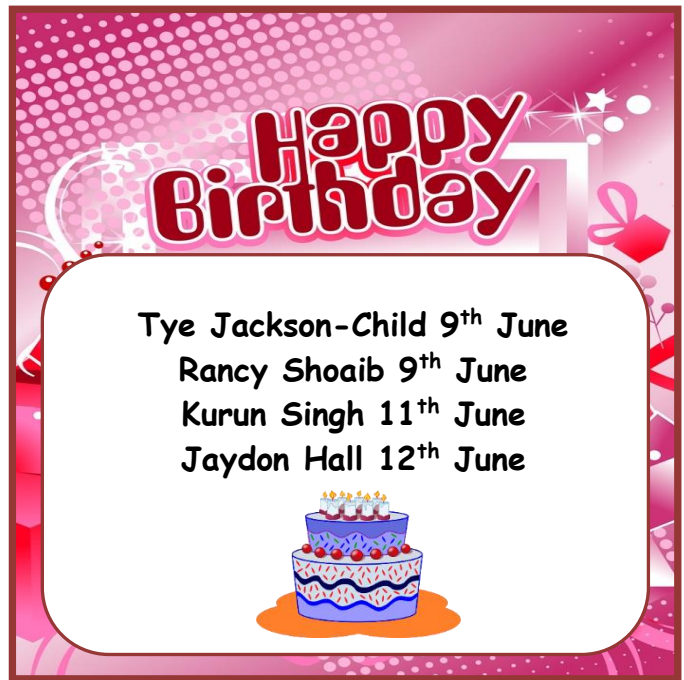

Talking about terrorism: tips for parents from the NSPCC

This advice from the NSPCC may be useful to help you as parents to support your children when talking about terrorism.

Children are exposed to news in many ways, and what they see can worry them. Our advice can help you have a conversation with your child:

- listen carefully to a child's fears and worries
- offer reassurance and comfort
- avoid complicated and worrying explanations that could be frightening and confusing
- help them find advice and support to understand distressing events and feelings
- children can always [contact Childline](https://www.nspcc.org.uk/what-we-do/news-opinion/supporting-children-worried-about-terrorism/) free and confidentially on the phone and online. Call us on **0800 1111**. Calls are free from landlines and mobiles in the UK. And they won't show up on your phone bill. Run, Hide, Tell: Advice from the Police Chiefs' Council



IN THE RARE EVENT OF
a firearms or weapons attack

RUN HIDE TELL



RUN to a place of safety. This is a far better option than to surrender or negotiate. If there's nowhere to go, then...

HIDE. It's better to hide than to confront. Remember to turn your phone to silent and turn off vibrate. Barricade yourself in if you can. Then finally and only when it is safe to do so...

TELL the police by calling 999.
