Curriculum Rationale

Our curriculum is based on the strong desire for every child to leave St. Anne's being prepared for the world spiritually, morally, socially and academically.

Aims

At St Anne's we believe in providing a personalised, broad and balanced curriculum that meets the needs of all pupils, and which endeavours to nurture and teach the Gospel Values by creating an environment where each child is given the opportunity to achieve excellence.

Key Objectives

- To deliver quality teaching so that children can gain knowledge, skills and understanding across all areas of the curriculum and develop critical thinking and problem solving skills.
- To embed the Gospel Values across all areas of the curriculum so that children, staff and parents work together to build a safe and caring learning environment.
- To provide meaningful experiences which will enrich learning, through visiting practitioners, creating "wonder and awe moments," outdoor activities, local and residential trips.
- To ensure children have a wide understanding of the world, starting with local knowledge in KS1, national knowledge in LKS2 and international knowledge in UKS2.
- To provide opportunities for all children to develop, use and celebrate their talents.

At Saint Anne's we have adopted an approach that seeks to connect learning and build and secure knowledge and skills by proving experiences, reflection and then action. We believe that this is how our children learn best at St. Anne's and have the best opportunity to translate one skill from one subject to another resulting in the potential for higher success.


Each term, classes will have an overarching enquiry-based topic to encourage children to identify their own questions and to become reflective learners. These termly topics will allow children to become fully immersed in learning across the curriculum. Over the course of the year, there will also be whole school themed weeks to recognise special celebrations and world events.

Our Teaching Philosophy

At Saint Anne's learning begins with the sharing of experience through enquiry e.g. Who were the Vikings? Why do we have a democracy? Does God love us all?

Next teaching helps pupils research, analyse and reflect on their experience helping to secure knowledge, understanding and skills.

Finally opportunities are created for pupils to put their learning into action through research, oral, written and project work to gain more experience
