

## Sports Premium

The government is providing additional funding of £150 million per annum for academic years 2013 to 2014 and 2014 to 2015 to improve provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. This funding provided jointly by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, is to improve the quality and breadth of sport and PE provision, including increasing participation in PE and sport so that all pupils develop healthy lifestyles and reach the performance levels they are capable of.

### PE and Sports Grant Allocation 2013-2014

Our school received a grant of £8,890 for primary school sports in the academic year 2013 -14 (7/12ths 2013/14 + 5/12ths 2014/15). This money will be used in a range of ways to support the provision of improved quality of PE and sport for all children.

During the year 2013/14 we will use this funding to:

Join the Calthorpe School Sport Partnership Alliance in order:

- for staff to work in partnership with a specialist PE teacher to raise confidence and competence in teaching PE and sport
- to secure professional development meetings for staff
- Provide training for Breakfast Club staff to develop Wake & Shake sessions
- Provide training for Lunchtime Supervisors to learn new playground games
- Provide cover to release staff for professional development
- Increase the range of extra-curricular provision
- Introduce a Change4Life club to support and engage children who don't choose to participate in physical activity
- Provide additional swimming lessons to ensure children in Year Six can swim 25 metres
- Organise a Singing Playgrounds Day and Inset for staff
- Organise workshops for parents to promote healthy eating and active lifestyles
- Establish an inter-school system to enable regular school sports competitions
- To support transport costs in order to engage in inter-school competitions
- Purchase additional resources to ensure children are active at playtime
