

Literacy

Writing: Planning, writing and editing across a range of genres selecting appropriate grammar and vocabulary, understanding how such choices can change and enhance meaning

- Poetry - The Convergence of the Twain
- Informal/Formal Letters (The Day the Crayons Quit)
- Narrative - Short scary stories (Short!) Describing settings, characters and atmosphere and integrating dialogue to convey character and advance the action
- Non-fiction - non-chronological report

Reading: Continue to read a range of texts discussing and evaluating how authors use language, including figurative language, considering the impact on the reader

Numeracy

Basic Skills: Children will revisit and consolidate all areas of Maths covered in preparation for secondary school.

Problem Solving: Children will carry out a range of open-ended investigations based on various areas of Maths. They will solve puzzles and problems, using reasoning.

Enterprise Challenge: Working in small groups, children will participate in an 'Enterprise Challenge'. They will need to draw on Maths knowledge to decide on pricing, profit etc. Children will:

- decide on a product
- develop the product
- make the product
- sell the finished articles
- assess their success.

RE

Pentecost: Children will learn about two stories from the New Testament about the coming of the Holy Spirit. They will learn about the Gifts and Fruits of the Holy Spirit and how they are important in the lives of Christians

Prayers: Children will gain a greater knowledge and understanding of the traditional prayers of the Church and some of the signs and actions associated with prayer. They will also study of some customs of prayer in other religions.

Belonging to the Church Community: Children will learn about the foundations of the life and teaching of the Catholic Church being rooted in the life and teaching of the Apostles.

Celebrating the life of Mary and the Saints: Children will explore some of the Church's beliefs about the Blessed Virgin Mary and the feasts that are celebrated in her honour. The children will consider why her role in the life of Christ was so important. Children will also learn about Mary and the saints being united with Christ in heaven.

Science

Animals including Humans

Children will be taught to:

- identify and name the main parts of the human circulatory system, and describe the functions of the heart, blood vessels and blood
- recognise the impact of diet, exercise, drugs and lifestyle on the way their bodies function
- describe the ways in which nutrients and water are transported within animals.
