

English

Writing:

Planning, writing and editing across a range of fiction and non-fiction genres selecting appropriate grammar and vocabulary, understanding how such choices can change and enhance meaning. Choosing the writing implement that is best suited for a task.

Reading:

Continue to read a range of texts discussing and evaluating how authors use language, including figurative language, considering the impact on the reader.

Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar:

Consolidate understanding of grammatical terminology learnt and accurately and appropriately use when discussing writing and reading.

Maths

Basic Skills: Children will revisit and consolidate all areas of Maths covered in preparation for secondary school.

Problem Solving: Children will carry out a range of open-ended investigations based on various areas of Maths. They will solve puzzles and problems, using reasoning.

Enterprise Challenge: Working in small groups, children will participate in an 'Enterprise Challenge'. They will need to draw on Maths knowledge to decide on pricing, profit etc. Children will:

- decide on a product
- develop the product
- make the product
- sell the finished articles
- assess their success.

RE

Easter: Children will study the story of Easter from the perspective of Thomas. Children will also learn about Easter and the promise of eternal life. They will be introduced to some associations with Baptism and the celebration of a Christian funeral.

Pentecost: Children will learn about two stories from the New Testament about the coming of the Holy Spirit. They will learn about the Gifts and Fruits of the Holy Spirit and how they are important in the lives of Christians

Belonging to the Church Community: Children will learn about the foundations of the life and teaching of the Catholic Church being rooted in the life and teaching of the Apostles.

Celebrating the life of Mary and the Saints: Children will explore some of the Church's beliefs about the Blessed Virgin Mary and the feasts that are celebrated in her honour. The children will consider why her role in the life of Christ was so important. Children will also learn about Mary and the saints being united with Christ in heaven.

Science

Body Health

Children will learn about how to keep their bodies healthy and how their bodies might be damaged. The focus is on lifestyle choices that humans make, including diet, exercise and drug use, and how these are informed by scientific evidence.

The Nature Library

Children will build on their knowledge of living things from previous years and deepen their understanding of why and how organisms are classified. They will explore the process of classification in some detail and how it differs from, but relates to, the identification of living things.
